KS 2 Year 3	Dawn of the Dinosaurs: Looking at the history of the different species of dinosaur as well as their geographic location. Links will be made to the 'Rocks and Soils' Science Topic. English will focus upon a number of books including fiction and non-fiction	Dawn of the Dinosaur — History of Mary Anning fossil hunter (3 weeks) Christmas Around the World This will be a PSHE based Learning Unit focusing on the celebration of Christmas and how it is recognised in different countries. During this time we will take the opportunity to look at performance and shape poetry as well as implementing art and DT into our learning	Oriental Express! As well as focusing on the geographical location of China and the continents of Asia and Europe, we will be investigating traditional customs including Chinese New Year. English will follow the storyof the 'Willow Pattern'. Also focusing on non-chronological reports linked to facts about China and writing play scripts about the Chinese New Year. Artwork will be created using a variety of media.	Plundering Pirates: Robert Louis Stevenson's classic 'Treasure Island' will be at the core of this topic. Children will focus on geography, history, science, Art and D&T, further developing skills begun in earlier topics. Children will learn about pirates and the traditions and legends that surround these mysterious characters	Author study Roald Dahl Alienated Aztecs: We travel back in time to Mexico to look at how these ancient civilisations have taught us a thing or two! Their gods and eccentric way of life along with their artwork and wonderful designs will intrigue and excite our learning! We shall be focusing on the historical aspect as chocolate was introduced to Britain by the Aztecs. To complement this we will be using Roald Dahl's Charlie and The Chocolate Factory' We will be learning more about the amazing author Roald Dahl, his eccentric stories and what exactly makes him the 'World's Number 1 Story teller'.
