

Adjectives

What are adjectives?

Children should be able to identify that they are describing words. Adjectives describe the noun.

Ask the children to describe an object using an adjective. Children to give 4 examples.

The children have looked at this description previously within lessons – so this should not be new to them.

Learning task

1. Identifying the adjectives used in the passage.
2. Using a thesaurus improve the adjectives used.
3. Write your own sentences using the adjectives you have chosen when up levelling.

Appearance
